CAMPUS RULES

In order to assure a safe and productive learning environment, the students at High Desert School are expected to adhere to the following rules in their classrooms and on their campus.

1. **WAIT CLEAR OF THE DOOR TO ENTER THE CLASSROOM** until the previous class has exited.
2. **BE PREPARED DAILY** by bringing class materials (i.e. paper, pencils, classwork, homework, 3-ring binder with dividers, daily planner, etc.) and a **reading book** to every class.
3. **BE SEATED** in your assigned seat by the time the bell rings.
4. **FOLLOW DIRECTIONS** given by an adult the **FIRST TIME**.
5. **BE COURTEOUS** to others by not using inappropriate language, rude gestures, put-downs, sexually harassing statements. Drinking from the same container as another student is unsanitary and discourteous. Hats and sunglasses are to be worn only outside. They will be confiscated and the owner assumes responsibility for their return.
6. **RESPECT OTHER PEOPLE'S RIGHTS** by keeping your hands, feet and other objects to yourself.
7. **RESPECT OTHER PEOPLE'S PROPERTY** by not damaging or writing on other students or the school's property (i.e. desks, walls, books, backpacks). Student will be charged the full replacement or repair cost for damaged property. Do not give, take, or receive a loan of money. Do not steal.
8. **NO FOOD OR DRINK** should be consumed in the classroom, except during an organized classroom activity. Water is allowed with teacher approval. Open drink containers are not to be brought on campus. No food or drink on the courts.
9. **NON-SCHOOL ITEMS SHOULD BE LEFT AT HOME**. Examples of non-school items that are not allowed at school are: electronic equipment including ipods, games, and disc players; toys and playing cards; magazines; gum; rollerblades; and skateboards, aerosol cans; markers and white out. Ballpoint and other ink pens are not allowed in students' possession or on campus. If confiscated, the item will be kept in the office and the owner assumes all responsibility for its return. No item should be brought to school to sell, especially candy, gum and CD's. **EXCEPTION:** A non-school item brought to school for classroom use must have prior approval of the teacher and be left in the office before school starts on the day it is needed. Cell phones must be kept turned off and in the student's backpack.
10. **IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE A PASS WHEN OUT OF THE CLASSROOM OR ASSIGNED AREA**. STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO REPORT IMMEDIATELY TO THEIR DESTINATION, NOT WANDER AROUND THE CAMPUS. Restroom use during class must be done using a pink pass to the office.

CLASSROOM CONSEQUENCES

1. Warning, Teacher/Student Conference
 2. Demerits, Teacher/Student Conference
 3. Detention, Demerits, Teacher/Student Conference, Teacher/Parent Conference
 4. Suspension From Class Into OCS for two days, Demerits, Teacher/Parent/Student Conference
 5. Suspension From All Classes Into OCS for 2-3 days, Demerits, Teacher/Parent/Principal Conference
 6. Suspension From School 2-5 days, Demerits, Teacher/Parent/Principal Conference
 7. Saturday School
- ◆ All demerit slips are to be returned with parent signatures.
 - ◆ Failure to return slips the next day will result in an additional 3 demerits.
 - ◆ Failure to return slips the second day will result in a detention and 5 demerits.
 - ◆ Once demerit slips are turned in to the office for recording the demerits will not be taken back.

OFFICE CONSEQUENCES

REFERRAL TO PRINCIPAL = 10 demerits
ON-CAMPUS SUSPENSION = 11 demerits
OFF-CAMPUS SUSPENSION = 11 demerits
